BAPTISM

If you are interested in learning more about Baptism, Contact Pastor Art.

Baptism is a public declaration of one's belief in God and a testimony of God's involvement in a person's life. It is a decision to tell the world that we love Jesus, that we believe He died and rose again for us, and that we want to live our lives for Him.

We at Spruce Grove Alliance Church understand baptism as a personal decision that each believer must make after entering into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. For that reason, we do not baptize infants or others who have not yet placed their faith and trust in Jesus.

Baptism is not required for salvation. The Bible says, "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9). Baptism in itself does nothing without faith. It is simply an outward sign or a public declaration of what God has done in a person's life.

Like all C&MA churches, Spruce Grove Alliance Church practices baptism by full immersion in a public setting. We understand this to be the Biblical pattern, expressing death to self and new life in Jesus Christ (see Romans 6). Under certain circumstances, however, we will consider a different method of baptism.

Child Dedication

We are committed to partnering with you as you seek to raise your child in the nurture and knowledge of the Lord. Child dedication is one option you will want to consider as you seek to pass along your faith to your children.

Child dedication is a formal commitment that parents make to the church family and to God to provide for the spiritual growth and development of their children. As such, it is a promise on the parents' part to raise their children in a loving, Christian home that is actively involved in a local church. The church family, in turn, promises to assist the family as they raise their children in the Christian faith.

Although the Bible does not suggest that God requires parents to dedicate their children, it does record at least two instances in which parents sought God's blessings for their children. In the Old Testament, Hannah dedicated Samuel to the Lord (1 Samuel 1:20-25), and in the New Testament, Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:22-33).

For children, a time of formal dedication to the Lord marks the beginning of their spiritual journey, and celebrates the blessings and protection of God throughout their whole life.

In most cases, a pastor of your choice from Spruce Grove Alliance Church will preside over your child's dedication. We recognize, however, the involvement of many others in your spiritual journey. You therefore may request that small group leaders, Sunday School teachers, pastors from other churches, or other significant spiritual mentors be involved in the dedication ceremony.

Giving at SGAC

How can I donate at SGAC?

We have four methods of donating to SGAC: **1. ONLINE GIVING**

Whether it is a one-time gift or you would like to schedule a recurring donation, you can now give online to Spruce Grove Alliance Church. With this new option, you are able to give using a Visa or MasterCard debit card or the traditional Visa or MasterCard credit cards.

Spruce Grove Alliance Church recognizes that there are those who will prefer to use their credit card to give, however, it is a desire of Spruce Grove Alliance Church that donors are not incurring debt when giving to the church.

2. DIRECT PAYMENT FROM A BANK ACCOUNT

Pick up a pre-authorized debit agreement form at the Welcome Centre. You can fill it out and then return it with a voided cheque - just drop it in one of the offering plates or return it to the Welcome Centre in an envelope marked "Confidential: Donations Clerk".

3. ENVELOPES IN THE CHAIR POCKETS

There are envelopes in the chair pockets in the sanctuary that you can use to make an offering at any time. Please print your name and address (and Giving Number if you have one) clearly so we can correctly disburse the funds and issue your tax receipt.

If you don't already have a Giving Number, please inquire in the office and we'd be happy to set you up with one. A Giving Number helps our staff in tracking donations and issuing accurate receipts.

4. INTERAC

Where are the funds used?

Future Development

The Future Development Team

... is going underground!

The Future Development Team is aiming to raise \$750,000 - and we need your help!

The Future Development Team, with the support of the Church Board, is aiming to begin preparing the church site for future construction. We have a lot of work to do to get ready!

This groundwork will include:

- Storm System install (\$100,000)
- Water line (\$100,000)
- Sewer line and tie in (\$125,000)
- Parking lot ground work and dirt removal (\$250,000)
- Foundation ground work (\$50,000)
- Power upgrade tie-in (\$75,000)
- Telecommunications and internet upgrade (\$50,000)

This work is part of the original Phase 1 work and the \$750,000 is part of the original \$6 million budget.

We are looking to raise \$750,000 to fully fund this preliminary stage of the project – site service upgrades.

The team has been hard at work preparing for this groundwork to begin:

In September we began working with our architect on the design development and preliminary engineering on the Christian Education Centre (we had put that work on hold as we turned our focus to fundraising for the project).

In October the City of Spruce Grove confirmed that we will require a development permit for the planned site upgrades. We have directed our architect to begin preparing the drawings required for that submission. We hosted a meeting with the architect and our ministry staff to discuss specific space requirements for the Christian Education Centre. At this meeting it was decided that a tour of other churches would be helpful to ensure that our new space is designed to best meet the needs of all of the groups that will use the new building.

The next step in this project – happening in parallel with our fundraising – is developing conceptual plans for the new build. We look forward to sharing these with the congregation for comment and feedback.

We encourage all those who call Spruce Grove Alliance Church home to consider how they can and will contribute to the success of this project. We are looking to raise \$750,000 to fully fund this preliminary stage of the project – site service upgrades.

The Christian & Missionary Alliance of Canada C&MA

The Christian and Missionary Alliance grew out of the vision of Rev. Albert Benjamin Simpson, who was ordained in the Presbyterian Church in 1865 and became the pastor in one of Canada's most prestigious pulpits. During the next number of years, the Holy Spirit revolutionized his life, making him more passionate for neglected people and people living in poverty at home and around the world.

In 1887, compelled by a sense of urgency to take the message of Jesus Christ to all nations, Simpson was used by God to give birth to The Christian and Missionary Alliance. It was only natural that his vision should extend to Canada. Many of the leaders in those first years were Canadians. The first Alliance church in Canada was Bethany Tabernacle, founded in 1887 by John Salmon in Toronto.

Dr. William Cassidy, a Toronto medical doctor, was the first ordained missionary in the new mission society. He died of smallpox en route to China. However, his death was the "spark that ignited the Alliance missionary blaze" which has been burning to this day.

By the 1920s, the C&MA became a major evangelical movement both in the United States and Canada. In Canada, saddle-bag preachers visited the homesteads of the West, and evangelists conducted campaigns in the East, bringing many people to Christ. By 1926 there were 19 "branches" in eastern and central Canada and four in western Canada. The growth of the church in the 1930s was in direct contrast to the depression experienced by the entire country.

In 1941, the Western Canadian Bible Institute was opened in Regina as a direct result of the need for trained workers.

Aiden Wilson Tozer served pastorates across the United States, including 30 years in Chicago.

He became known as a writer with a wider evangelical audience and his writings continue to influence Christians around the world. His final pastorate was at the Avenue Road Church in Toronto, Ontario. From there, his sermons and writings greatly impacted Canadians in the post-World War II years.

Throughout the early years, the C&MA in Canada was governed by the U.S. Alliance. An autonomous Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada came to a new direction during the founding Assembly held in Winnipeg in June 1980. A constitution was adopted, a president elected, and a Board of Directors chosen in preparation for full Canadian autonomy January 1, 1981. The two organizations, from Canada and the U.S., still maintain a close cooperative relationship today.

Over the past 30 plus years, the Canadian C&MA has had four presidents: Mel Sylvester (1980-1992), Arnold Cook (1992-2000), Franklin Pyles (2000-2012) and David Hearn (2012-present). We have grown from 241 churches to more than 440.

Who We Are

The Christian and Missionary Alliance (the C&MA) in Canada is a group of approximately 440 local churches across Canada that aims to be a Christ-centred, Spirit-empowered, and Mission-focused movement in everything we do. We send people to live on mission locally and globally.

Our ultimate goal is to fulfill the Great Commission and bring Matthew 24:14 to fruition: "And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come."

The C&MA is taking steps to complete this mission by focusing on least-reached people groups in the world. We aim to challenge our church members to live on mission with God, whether that be in a Canadian suburb or in a remote mountain village in Asia. Join us as we complete God's call to tell everyone about the Good News of Jesus Christ!



Centered in Jesus Christ, we will thrive spiritually, build community, and reach the lost by loving our community and serving the world.
